2. Hazards Identification

Potential Health Effects

Eye Contact - Causes irritation with symptoms of reddening, tearing, stinging and swelling.
Skin - Causes irritation with symptoms of reddening, itching, and swelling.
Ingestion - Causes abdominal pain, nausea, and vomiting.
Inhalation - Causes irritation of nose, throat, and lungs - headache - nausea

4. First Aid Measures

Eye Contact

In case of contact, flush eyes with plenty of lukewarm water. Get medical attention if irritation develops.

Skin Contact

In case of contact, wash affected areas with soap and water. Immediately remove contaminated clothing and shoes. Get medical attention if irritation develops and persists.

Inhalation

If inhaled, remove to fresh air. Get medical attention if irritation develops.

Ingestion

If ingested, do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. Get medical attention.

5. Fire Fighting Measures

Suitable Extinguishing Media

All extinguishing media are suitable.

Special Fire Fighting Procedures

Firefighters should be equipped with self-contained breathing apparatus to protect against potentially toxic and irritating fumes. Use cold water spray to cool fire-exposed containers to minimize risk of rupture.

Unusual Fire/Explosion Hazards

Toxic and irritating gases/fumes may be given off during burning or thermal decomposition.

6. Accidental Release Measures

Spill and Leak Procedures

Cleanup personnel must use appropriate personal protective equipment. Cover spill with inert material (e.g., dry sand or earth) and collect for proper disposal.

7. Handling and Storage

Storage Temperature:

minimum:	1° C (33.8° F)
maximum:	49° C (120.2° F)

Handling/Storage Precautions

Avoid breathing dust, vapor, or mist. Avoid contact with skin and clothing. Avoid contact with eyes. Use only with adequate ventilation/personal protection. Wash thoroughly after handling. Keep container closed when not in use. Protect from freezing.

Industrial Hygiene/Ventilation Measures
